

MARDI GRAS AND KING CAKE

King Cake is only available during Carnival season. And it is quite delish! Bakeries across New Orleans start selling the cake on King's Day, January 6th, and they don't stop till the season of Lent begins.

The King Cake dates back to the 1800s brought to New Orleans from France.

A King Cake is an oval-shaped bakery delicacy, crossed between a coffee cake and a French pastry. It's decorated in royal colors of PURPLE which signifies "Justice," GREEN for "Faith," and GOLD for "Power." These colors were chosen to resemble a jeweled crown honoring the Wise Men who visited the Christ Child on Epiphany. In the past such things as coins, beans, pecans, or peas were also hidden in each

King Cake.

Today, a tiny plastic baby is the common prize. At a party, the King Cake is sliced and served. Each person looks to see if their piece contains the "baby." If so, then that person is named "King" for a day and bound by custom to host the next party and provide the King Cake.

You can't celebrate Mardi Gras without one of these. They're great for breakfast, lunch, dinner or just for a snack! New Orleans bakeries now ship across the nation. Try one out!

ARCHITECTURAL COMMITTEE

The Architectural Committee meets on a bi-weekly basis to discuss ongoing and future home improvement projects. This is a voluntary committee that considers the best interest of the community as a whole in regards to making any decisions on requests for exterior renovations and improvements such as: roof replacement, painting, concrete work (walkways/driveways), fencing, etc.

Some tips to consider prior to submitting an architectural approval request:

- Be familiar with the bylaws and deed restrictions in your section
- Be aware that majority of the Binglewood community is in a 100year flood plan.
- Please contact the Civic Club prior to applying for any city permits.
- When submitting an architectural approval include all drawings and designs.
- The architectural committee typically makes a decision within 30days.
