CURBS AND GUTTERS PROJECT

Below are the activities planned for October 2018. For inquiries, please email construction@binglewood.com.

- Phase change for the project has been accepted as of 09/18/2018
- Proceeding Phase 1, TBS is planning on starting Railton St. TBS will install 24" RCP Storm Sewer followed by paving the street. Phase 3 step 9-10
- Springview Phase 4 steps 2 and 3. Storm Sewer will be installed followed by concrete paving.
- Aruba Between Pitner and Springview. Storm sewer has previously been installed, new connection will be made with Springview followed by concrete paving.
- Completion of James Lee Park is anticipated as well. Shade structure permit was submitted and sodding has been schedule.

VEHICLE BREAK INS

Binglewood had a series of confirmed vehicle break-in on September 17th at 5:30 in the morning. Two individuals were working the streets wearing back packs and masks. One individual was armed with a gun. They were opening unlocked cars and taking what they could find. On September 25th, at approximately 4 in the morning, two individuals were arrested in Spring Shadows — we do not know if they are the same, but it sounds familiar.

Considering they had a gun, we caution you on approaching them: please call the cops. If you were affected by a crime, please call HPD and file a police report. If you have cameras, provide HPD the video. Police patrols are assigned by crime statistics, and those are generated from reported crimes. Even if nothing was stolen, and your car was broken into, call HPD.

DEED RESTRICTIONS

This month's highlight focuses on signs. Political signs and other forms of bandit signs are prohibited. The deed restrictions are as follows:

- Sections 1-5: Use of Land "(b) No sign of any kind shall be displayed to the public view of any residential lot except one sign ... advertising the property for sale or rent..."
- Section 6: Section 9. Signs "No advertising signs (except ... For Rent" or "For Sale" ...), billboards, ... shall be erected, placed or permitted to remain on any portion of the Subdivision..."

The Super Neighborhood Report indicated an increase in gang activity in the Pitner area as evidenced by tagging. Tagging or graffiti associated with gangs is characterized by the use of signs and symbols with one solid color, legible but unstyled, found in easy to reach places, often crossed out and usually includes the gang name.
