# PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



#### It's a new day in Binglewood!

We are always working to make Binglewood the best place to live and are considering some major improvements and beautification projects in 2024. We have sent out a survey to ask you what social events you want the Civic Club to sponsor this year. We are working to improve compliance. We are also trying out having three meetings on Saturday mornings and two on Wednesday evenings to see if more of you are able

to attend. Also below is an end-of-the-year scorecard of all things accomplished in 2023 and things we may want to work on in 2024. Take a few minutes to read and let us know what you think!

#### SAFETY

**Watch out for Binglewood pets and people!** Since we do not have sidewalks throughout Binglewood and it gets dark when returning from work (until Daylight Saving Time in March), please be aware that drivers can't always see you! Wear safety vests or safety tape or carry a light so you can be seen. Also, look around you and don't take it for granted that all drivers are focused and can see you. At some point in the day, everyone is a pedestrian. Unfortunately, pedestrian injuries and fatalities remain high. In 2021, 7,388 pedestrians were killed – a 13% increase from 2020 –

and more than 60,000 pedestrians were injured nationwide. The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) raises awareness of the dangers to pedestrians and provides some great tips to keep pedestrians safe.

### 8 Walking Safety Tips (from the NHTSA)

- Follow the rules of the road and obey signs and signals.
- Walk on sidewalks whenever they are available.
- If there is no sidewalk, walk facing traffic and as far from traffic as possible.
- Cross streets at crosswalks or intersections. Look for cars in all directions, including those turning left or right.
- If a crosswalk or intersection is not available, locate a well-lit area where you have the best view of traffic. Wait for a gap in traffic that allows enough time to cross safely; continue watching for traffic as you cross.
- Watch for cars entering or exiting driveways, or backing up in parking lots.
- Avoid alcohol and drugs when walking; they impair your abilities and your judgment.
- Embrace walking as a healthy form of transportation get up, get out and get moving!

# 8 Safety Tips for Drivers

- Look out for pedestrians everywhere, at all times.
- Use extra caution when driving in hard-to-see conditions, such as nighttime or bad weather.
- Slow down and be prepared to stop when turning or otherwise entering a crosswalk.
- Yield to pedestrians in crosswalks and stop well back from the crosswalk to give other vehicles an opportunity to see the crossing pedestrians so they can stop too.
- Never pass vehicles stopped at a crosswalk. There may be people crossing where you can't see.
- Never drive under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs.
- Follow the speed limit (which is 30 in residential areas!), especially around people on the street, in school zones and in neighborhoods where children are present.
- Be extra cautious when backing up and look for pedestrians.





# SCORECARD FOR 2023

Here is what your Civic Club accomplished in 2023. We are rolling out a dues drive this month and wanted to give you an idea of where your money goes.

- Requested and received copy of major study of drainage plans for our neighborhood and held a community-wide meeting with City and County representatives regarding their plans.
- Maintained a 24/7 and daily in-person constable patrol through August 2023 but had to cancel due to lack of voluntary funding by residents.
- Posted a List of Home Services Providers on website (especially for new homeowners).
- Street lights installed throughout Binglewood by the City of Houston at no cost to Binglewood.
- Social events such as Family Picnic Sundays to bring neighborhood together.
- Instituted common sense compliance program to enforce deed restrictions and policies.
- New stone park signs installed in James W. Lee Park at no cost to Binglewood (see pictures below).

## PLANS FOR 2024

Here is what we are planning to work on (so far) for 2024. Please attend our next meeting and give us your ideas so we can be sure we are focusing on the things you care about!

- *Yard Parking*-We have proposed that the yard parking ordinance be revised to make it clear that yard parking is not allowed and that placing dirt or ground gravel, etc. does not constitute a "driveway."
- *BCC Website*-Add a calendar that you can use to add events to your smart phone, iPad or computer.
- *Rail Crossing Clean up*-We have petitioned Union Pacific to clean up the drainage ditches and fix the drainage pipes throughout their easement along Hempstead Road.
- **Drainage Project Engineering Plans**-We have met with Harris County and federal officials in one-on-one meetings re detention ponds that could be

- *Tree Canopy*-Establish a tree canopy along either side of the entrance on Sonneville with donated trees.


