




# 2024 Dues Collections (by Section) as of December 31, 2024

#### BINGLEWOOD COMMUNITY

Binglewood was established in the 1950s as a deed-restricted community of mostly single story, ranch style homes with large lots and mature trees. There are 741 homes within six sections, the last having been developed in the late 1990s. We are located within the Spring Branch area west of Bingle and east of Blalock, and between Clay Rd. on the north and Kernwand Dr. on the south.

Residents enjoy easy access to 1-10, US-290, the 510 Loop and the Sam Houston Tollway. Binglewood is close to shopping and dining districts, as well as medical services located in and near Memorial City Memorial Hermann Hospital Campus. We are also very fortunate to have James W. Lee Park, a beautiful City of Houston park, in the heart of our neighborhood, with playground equipment, picnic benches and a walking real.

#### BINGLEWOOD CIVIC ASSOCIATION, INC.

Our residents take exceptional pride in their homes and community. As each section was built, the developers established deed restrictions intended to maintain the high standards of the community.

The Binglewood Civic Association, Inc. was established as a property owners association to oversee maintenance of these standards, as well as encouraging a sense of community among its residents by planning and organizing social events.

#### AN ACTIVE CIVIC ASSOCIATION BENEFITS BINGLEWOOD

The Binglewood Civic Association (BCA) has been an active organization since it was first created. Due to the hard work of our volunteers, social activities have included a wide array of family-friendly activities. The efforts of our Board Members and Officers have been indispensable in helping to maintain the standards of the neighbord od by establishing and maintaining strong relationships with our local government officials and agencies.

The deed restrictions are essentially the same for Sections 1-5. Since the BCA By-Laws were established, residents have been encouraged to support the civic association by paying annual dues. Voluntary annual dues of \$50.00 apply to Sections 1-5. When Section 6 was built, the developer established deed restrictions different from those for Sections 1-5 and established mandatory annual dues which are currently only \$50.00. BCA then became a combination property owners association and homeowners association. Binglewood Civic Association, Inc. represents both.

BCA functions are important to the entire neighborhood. The dues collected support the activities of community volunteers and the elected officers and directors who work on behalf of all of the residents of Binglewood.

#### MEMBER BENEFITS

Members in good standing may run for office and have a vote in elections for the three Board Member positions and the five Officer positions. These volunteers are responsible to the Binglewood commanity and must use their best judgment in arriving at decisions that are fiscally responsible, improve Binglewood, increase its property values, and enhance the quality of life.

Drainage Project Engineering Plans-We have met with the City of Houston engineers to add a missing pipe to the west side of Hollister St. so water can drain directly into Brickhouse Gully. The storm sewer system was not built according to the as-built drawings and we could not find the connection from the storm sewer serving Sonneville to Brickhouse Gully. A CCTV/vactor truck (used to clean sewers and perform sewer truck (used to clean sewers and perform sewer system maintenance and repairs that includes Closed Circuit Television equipment) was dispatched to do a more thorough investigation. Future plans are pending but we are pushing for resolution in 2025 prior to Hurricane Season!

- Rail Crossing Clean-up-We continue to petition Union Pacific to clean up the drainage ditches and fix the drainage pipes throughout their easement along Hempstead Road.
- Street Panels Over Railroad Tracks at Clay Rd. and Hempstead Rd.-Approved by Union Pacific and in the budget for 2025. It's currently a rough ride over Clay Road across Hempstead.







• <u>Cameras or Patrol?</u>-We are considering hiring an hourly security patrol on different days and different hours to patrol around the park OR installing two or more Flock license plate-reader cameras.

• <u>Kempwood at Hollister</u> <u>Median</u>-We have adopted the median so we can clean up the landscaping and add a mini-mural painted on the traffic control box (which is to be replaced soon) so the median leading into our neighborhood from Kempwood is a positive reflection on Binglewood.



# Really Early Voting



#### ELIGIBLE VOTERS MAY APPLY FOR ANNUAL BALLOT BY MAIL FOR ALL 2025 ELECTIONS STARTING JANUARY 1

- The Harris County Clerk's Office reminds voters eligible to vote by mail that applications for an annual ballot by mail for all 2025 elections are now being accepted. Registered voters who are 65 or older, have a disability, or meet other requirements under Texas law may <u>submit an annual application</u> starting January 1, 2025.
- "An annual ballot by mail ensures that eligible voters can conveniently participate in elections throughout the year," said Harris County Clerk Teneshia Hudspeth. "It's essential to complete the application accurately to avoid any delays in receiving your ballot."
- What is an Annual Ballot by Mail? Eligible voters can mark "annual" on their application to receive a mail ballot for all 2025 elections held within their jurisdiction. This includes the May uniform election date, any resulting runoff elections, the November general election, and any subsequent runoff elections.
- Application Expiration. The application will expire on December 31, 2025, unless the voter cancels it, their voter registration is canceled, or they register in a new county.
- Choosing Specific Elections. Voters who prefer to vote by mail in specific elections but do not wish to apply for an annual ballot can submit individual applications. Each election has a deadline for applying to vote by mail.
- How to Apply. Download the application at HarrisVotes.com, complete it, and return it to the Harris County Clerk's Office.
- Ballots are not sent automatically to all registered voters in Texas and there is no same-day voter registration.

Jury Duty

✓ According to the Texas Judicial Branch, jury service is a civic duty and privilege for citizens to participate in and influence the justice system. Over 2.7 million people are eligible to serve in over 100 Harris County courts.

✓ Harris County now has 2,752,109 potential jurors!

✓ The jury wheel is reset every two years, which is why some Houstonians may feel they

are never called to jury duty.

✓ The "jury wheel" is a database from which residents are randomly selected to serve on various courts and grand juries. "When the wheel is randomized and set, you may be at the bottom of the wheel. And we may not get to you before we reconstitute the wheel. On the other hand, if you say you get summoned all the time, bear in mind not only do we call jurors, but the federal courts call jurors, as well as the municipal court," Clerk Burgess said.

✓ Burgess said the frequent resets help add new citizens, remove those who have moved


out and add updated addresses to the jury system.

✓ Harris County Sheriff Ed Gonzalez warned there have been some scams popping up where impersonators of local officials ask for money from constituents.

✓ Gonzalez said officials would not call a juror to ask for money or offer gifts such as gift cards. Texas Courts say citizens are mailed a summons to report for jury service.

# Prepare for the FREEZE!

#### Freeze Warning Tips

- When temperatures dip below 32°F, your water pipes can freeze, potentially bursting and causing costly damage. Try these tips:
- 1. Let Your Faucets Drip-Run both hot and cold water in a very fine stream from all of your apartment's faucets—kitchen sink, bathroom sinks, bathtubs, showers, etc. This helps prevent pipes from freezing by keeping the water moving.
- 2. Open Your Cupboards-Leave the cabinet doors under all sinks open so that the pipes are exposed to warm air. It's also a good idea to leave bathroom and kitchen doors open to help the airflow.
- 3. Heat Your Home- If you're leaving for the day, make sure the heat is still on. Set it to the lowest setting (60-65°F is recommended). Don't turn off your heat completely, as this can cause your pipes to freeze.

Stay safe and warm during the cold weather!




### Solar Panels

 Salespeople tell us to take out a loan, get solar rooftop panels installed, and your savings on energy can more than make up for the monthly debt payments.

• The state grid and CenterPoint's transmission lines have failed us. No wonder that from 2011 to 2023, home rooftop solar installations have surged from 1,300 to 271,000, according to the Solar Energy Industries Association. It helped that federal solar tax credits were raised to 30% by Congress.

• BCA has some reasonable rules in its Policies and Guidelines but State Law allows you to install them if they will fulfill 10% of your energy demands

 Backyard pergolas as used in Arizona and New Mexico work well. Cost is \$10-15K





## Solar Panels

- Here are five tips:
  - Don't go with an offer from a door-to-door salesperson. Contact nonprofits such as Solar United Neighbors or the Texas Solar Energy Society.

https://solarunitedneighbors.org/locations/texas/ [Schedule a call with their help desk and ask for a review of any bids you've received. The nonprofit provides free education and will share names of installers selected by their coop members in the past.]


- Get multiple proposals—three bids.
- Check the installer's references. They should be local.
- If the installer offers a loan, compare its terms to those you could get elsewhere.
- Be sure that you understand the terms especially if you're getting it through an installer.
- Double-check any claims about tax credits.

## Bullet Train-Update



AMTRAK is working on the project along with Texas Central.



The bullet train is still projected to run from Dallas to Houston with the end of the rail line to be located in Houston at the abandoned Northwest Mall.



The proposed approximately 240mile route would offer a total travel time of less than 90 minutes between Houston and Dallas.



They are working on studies and planning everything that they need.



Financially, they are also still applying for grants (all of the money is not there yet) but there are federal grants that they are applying for.



Currently, there is no start date or any concrete plans.
